Difference between people aged below 35 or 35 and above?



Δ 0.15

Yes, there is a statistically significant difference between age groups.

GENDER

Difference between men and woman?



Δ 0.17

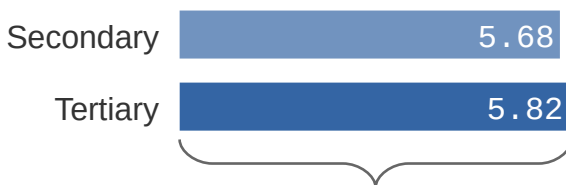
Yes, there is a statistically significant difference between men and woman.

OVERALL AVERAGE

5.74 / 10

EDUCATION

Difference between people with secondary and tertiary education?



Δ 0.14

Yes, there is a statistically significant difference between different education levels.

MIGRATION

Difference between people with or without migration background? Born in the country?



Δ 0.10

Yes, there is a statistically significant difference between people with and without a migration background.
