





# **CROss-National Online Survey 3 (CRONOS-3) Panel**

- Part of Infra4NextGen project
- Five waves of 90 questions (18 per wave for each NextGenEU area)
- Questions developed by ESS and subject area experts
- Recruitment from R10 and R11 main stage ESS interviews
- Fielded in 11 countries (Austria, Belgium, Czechia, Finland, France, Hungary, Iceland, Poland, Portugal, Slovenia and the United Kingdom)
- First wave in September 2024
- Data will be analysed alongside existing data for a series of policy briefs

# **CROss-National Online Survey (CRONOS) - part of ESS**

The European Social Survey ERIC has been developing its web-interviewing infrastructure since 2017 when the world's first cross-national probabilitybased input-harmonised web panel was launched (CRONOS1).

This web pilot study aimed to assess the effectiveness of panel recruitment off the back of an existing crossnational face-to-face survey (European Social Survey Round 8)

CRONOS 1 served as a 'proof of concept' to prove the feasibility of a web panel.

### **CROss-National Online Survey (CRONOS)**

The European Social Survey ERIC has been developing its web-interviewing infrastructure since 2017 when the world's first cross-national probability-based input-harmonised web panel was launched (CRONOS1). This web pilot study aimed to assess the effectiveness of panel recruitment off the back of an existing crossnational face-to-face survey (European Social Survey Round 8) in terms of costs, samp... #### CRONOS3

CRONOS3 collects data in 2025 across 5 waves in 11 countries, focusing on NextGenEU themes: Green, Digital, Healthy, Strong, and Equal.

#### CRONOS2

CRONOS2 was fielded in 12 countries - Austria, Belgium, Czechia, Finland, France, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Portugal, Slovenia, Sweden, and the United Kingdom - from November 2021 until March 2023.

#### CRONOS1

Building on previous experience of mixed-mode research, the ESS developed a CROss-National Online Survey (CRONOS1) panel in 2016, fielded in Estonia, the UK, and Slovenia.

A comprehensive evidence base is needed to understand how best to address inequalities and build an inclusive society. Within the Infra4NextGen project, the Make it Equal pillar explores beliefs about the causes and responsibility for these inequalities, such as whether they are seen as a result of systemic injustice or individual failings. 

The Gender and Generations Survey (GGS) is a large-scale, longitudinal study conducted across multiple countries, focusing on relationships, family dynamics, and demographic behavior.

It collects data on fertility, partnership, parenting, ageing, and intergenerational exchanges, with a special focus on gender roles and how they evolve across generations.

The GGS is part of the Generations and Gender Programme (GGP), coordinated by a consortium of international research institutions, and aims to inform social policy and understand population change in developed countries.

The GGS Teaching Dataset is an extract from Wave 1 of the GGS-II data, containing a selection of variables and a subset of respondents from several countries. The GGS Teaching Dataset has been created with the aim of simplifying and facilitating the use of the rich and complex GGS data.



#### Countries

The survey is, for this round, implemented from the GGP Central Coordination Office's at NIDI in the Hague to ensure that data is collected efficiently and effectively across a wide range of countries. The survey uses a new questionnaire which ensures comparability with the the FFS (1990's) and the previous GGS (2000's).




